Parish Council Report

<u>Outreach</u>

Parish Council strongly endorses Outreach in line with its commitment as stated in our Parish Profile and Mission Action Plan (MAP). We are a Parish that is outward looking, working in the wider community and reaching out through a number of need-based events and activities.

We believe that by doing so, we move from the edge to the centre and build the life of our local community. With God's grace we hope to attract new members.

Drop In Centre

It is encouraging that almost two and a half years after the June 2021 Storms, this group continues to grow. Open every Tuesday from 1pm to 4pm, the church hall at Kalorama is open and anyone can drop in for cuppa, a slice of cake and a chat. There is an "open door" pantry for anyone in need and the cost is covered by donations. A big thank you to those Parishioners who open up and provide the refreshments.

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care is a quiet strength of the parish, often but not exclusively associated with women's ministry. In our parish, pastoral care often is just quietly sensing a need and responding to it with gentleness and humility, guided by the example of Jesus' loving care. Special thanks go to Doug Wilson for his visitation ministry to those confined to their homes.

Exercise Classes

Held every Wednesday at 11am and covered by the Shire's Regional Community Recovery Grant Program, this is run by Form & Practice in St. Michael's Hall. The group has steadily grown and proved very popular

Table Tennis

A small but consistent group meet at 10am every Friday in the Kalorama Hall. It is encouraging that a second group has begun on Tuesday's at 8pm

Fairs

The Autumn Fair at St. Matthew's and the Book Fair and Cup Day Fair at St. Michael's have become a tradition that not only raises valuable funds for the

Parish but gives us the opportunity to promote our beautiful churches and grounds. Takings from the Fairs is significant although there appears to be a downward trend. In addition, as the congregation ages and people move off the mountain, the challenge will be to continue to provide the high standard we have set ourselves with fewer people.

ANZAC Day Service and Carols by Candlelight

How wonderful to see such support for these events which are so valued by the local community and have become such an important tradition.

<u>Grants</u>

In line with our MAP, we have been successful in upgrading our facilities. In particular, we have connected the donated generator to St. Michael's Hall allowing us to operate not only in the event of a power outage but as an emergency relief centre if approved by the State Emergency Coordinator. We also received funding for a shed and concrete slab at St. Michael's not only to store generator fuel but also provide valuable storage space.

A second defibrillator is now installed in St. Matthew's and registered with Ambulance Victoria and the local authorities.

We also have a volunteer grant application submitted to Aaron Violi MP. We have been approved to go to stage 2 (only 25% of application were approved) and are hopeful of a positive result next year. The request is for a permanent PA system as well as a church BBQ to be used appropriately at our various outreach events rather than currently borrowing them.

Parish Council

Churchwardens Report

This year has been more productive with three Wardens on board, plus a full Parish Council.

It has been an interesting time. Rev. Andrew Smith resigned in April to take up a position as Vicar at Panton Hills in July. Rev. Tony Copley took up the position of Acting Vicar, until mid-October, followed by Rev. Ken Holt whose ministry will continue until mid-January 2024 when our new vicar Rev. Jenny Poulter is commences.

Buildings.

1. Vicarage:

With a change of vicar, maintenance and repairs and a general clean-up were appropriate. Some downstairs window frames were replaced due to weather damage on the western face. Meanwhile the upper area has been totally repainted and refreshed by the very able team of Keith Pollock and his wife Pam. A great job – thank you! The garden was quite overgrown at the end of Winter. This has been cleared and will be maintained regularly by a contractor in future. New bright energy-efficient LED light bulbs have been fitted throughout and new fire extinguishers and smoke detectors installed. All locks are about to be re-keyed.

Some loose capping-tiles on brickwork needs refixing together with some minor plumbing and electrical work before Rev. Jenny takes up residence in 2024.

2. St. Michael's Roof Repairs:

This has been an ongoing saga! Promises by one roofing contractor failed to materialise and a quote by another was excessive. A more reasonable quote by a third contractor has been accepted but work has been delayed by poor weather and project backlogs. It is expected that works will commence in early December weather permitting.

3. Bell Towers

The wardens responded to a diocese bell tower audit in August. This documented concerns the parish has had for some time about the support structure for St. Michael's bell. An engineer's report has been submitted and further inspections are scheduled once access to the tower has been improved for a long extension ladder. Works to strengthen and secure the bell are planned for 2024.

4. General Maintenance:

Ongoing maintenance is managed by Peter A. and the two Keiths. Gutters are now being cleaned annually at both churches, halls and the vicarage.

Doug has continued to take care of St. Michael's garden. To assist him, a new electric lawn mower was purchased this year. Additional volunteers for the mowing roster at both churches would be very welcome. Generally the garden at St. Matthew's is taken care of by parishioners, but extra hands at working bees are always appreciated.

Attention to rotten wood on the north side glass doors of St. Michael's Hall is pending.

Health & Safety

Safety inspections were conducted each quarter throughout the year to identify issues and arrange remediation where required. This included checking fire extinguishers, first aid kits, electrical appliances, lighting, facilities and other equipment and fittings. The Diocese conducted their annual safety audit of the parish properties in February and the subsequent audit report found the parish to be fully compliant with statutory requirements.

Fund Raising

This is an important area to help keep the Church afloat. We have been fortunate to have received bequests in the past which have helped with both major works and the day-to-day church ministry.

In March a "Minifair" was held at St. Matthew's with the sale of plants, books and teas. Then the annual Book Fair was held in June. The annual Cup Day Fair at St. Michael's was again a community success and generated over \$10,000 to help fund the ongoing work of the parish. A wonderful team of helpers made this event possible and special thanks go to Peter Adams again for his guidance and direction.

Worship Services

Services at St. Matthew's and St. Michael's have been revitalised since the pandemic assisted by the dedicated work of a number of parishioner volunteers. Attendance numbers are increasing. Thanks go to sacristans, lay readers and readers, flower arrangers and sides-persons who prepare for and tend worship services each week. Special thanks to Merilyn, Keith P and Wendy for music and also to our "tea people" for the after-church 'cuppa'.

Churchwardens

Election of Churchwardens and Members of the Parish Council

The Parish Council is composed of up to 9 representatives - those **elected** by the annual general meeting of parishioners, and those **appointed** by the vicar.

There are 3 churchwarden positions and up to 6 council member positions that can be filled.

Elections

Nominations have been received for:

- 2 churchwardens AND
- 4 members of parish council.

As there is no surplus of nominations, no election is required. Those nominated will take up their positions on parish council for the 2023-24 year.

Vicars Appointments

In addition to the above, Rev. Ken Holt has appointed Keith Drummond as a churchwarden.

The 2 remaining parish council positions are available for appointment by either Ken or Rev. Jenny Poulter when she commences in January 2024.

Election of Lay Representatives to the Parish Nominators

The Nominations committee (formerly called the Incumbency committee) represents the parish if there is a vacancy for the vicar of the parish. The Parish Nominators work with Diocesan Nominators to provide a recommendation to the area bishop.

According to Diocesan guidelines it should consist of 3 elected members – one from the parish as a whole and one from each worship centre. In addition, the churchwardens appoint one of their number to the committee within 30 days of the AGM.

Elected members of the current Nominations committee are:

- Barbara Blomfield
- Keith Pollock

Each of these members has re-nominated for a position on the committee for 2024. As the number of nominations is equal to the positions available, no election is required. These members will continue in the role for 2024.

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
